New to Seagate

Seagate Mobile Farm Market is a

"Huckster Wagon" that was pulled by a pickup, now we have a great refrigerated truck. Our truck went to 18 different locations bi-weekly. The market offered fresh local fruits and vegetables to a population living in a food desert. Customers were able to use their Farmers Market coupons, WIC Farm Coupons or SNAP card to purchase fresh and healthy alternatives to the "corner store" purchases.

ERA (**Eat Right Academy**) Seagate's 8 week nutrition and cooking class saw 38 individuals to the program completion. This is 38 families on their way to good nutrition and combating childhood obesity!
